## **Groundbreaking and Progress – Construction Kicks Off**

Wartburg construction kick-off of the new 50,500 square-foot building on March 1. The groundbreaking ceremony marked a momentous occasion, symbolizing the start of a new project that will shape the future and bring forth innovation and progress.





### Campus Preservation and Development

The Wartburg Home of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, known today simply as Wartburg, has been a staple of the Mount Vernon community since 1866, when it first opened its doors as the Wartburg Orphans' Farm School. In 1899, Wartburg entered into the senior care industry. Now, over a century and a half later, Wartburg is on its way to becoming a state-of-the-art senior care facility as we embark on construction of the Berkemeier Living Center for Alzheimer's and dementia patients. As we construct this latest addition, campus preservation is front of mind. See how we are maintaining respect for the tradition and history of the Wartburg campus:

- The Berkemeier Living Center is named after Wartburg's second president, Rev. Dr. Gottlieb C. Berkemeier, and is situated on the same site where the Berkemeier Auditorium once was located.
- Carefully chiseled bricks were preserved from the original Berkemeier Auditorium in recognition of Rev. Dr. Gottlieb C. and Mrs. Berkemeier. The bricks will be available for purchase as part of our fundraiser to commemorate the building construction.
- Being adjacent to the existing Rehab Building and Chapel, the new center will create a courtyard, reinforcing the context of new and old.
- Design elements of both the Rehab Building and Chapel will be incorporated into the new building, including the use of similar materials like brick, metal panels and stone.
- The first floor will feature a communal lobby/gallery space for small gatherings and the display of Wartburg history and Berkemeier artifacts.

### Uncompensated Care

The Skilled Nursing Facility, Licensed Home Care and Adult Day Care programs accept all patients regardless of their ability to pay or payer source. Many of the seniors we serve live at or below the poverty line and are eligible for Medicaid, which through its established rates reimburses Wartburg for providing the care. However, in many cases this reimbursement is below the actual cost incurred. The cost of uncompensated care is as follows:
